## Description

Built 1992, comprises five-storey (including mansard), sixteen-bay (plus circular corner tower) frontage onto Butcher Street with smooth painted rendered façade at ground floor, red brick façade to upper floors. Slate mansard, 9 no. lead covered round-headed dormers, square-headed windows within. Painted, smooth rendered corner tower with square hipped slate roof. Polyester powder coated four-pane pivot casement windows. Current use is four star hotel, restaurants and bar with 90no. bedrooms and 3no. luxury bedroom suites, opened May 2002. Photograph: Right-hand side of building in the photograph is that closest to The Diamond, left-hand side is towards City Walls at Butcher Gate entrance to the City.

## History

This site includes what had been frontages onto Butcher Street (almost all); frontages onto Lower Magazine Street including Masonic Hall; and buildings associated with The City Steam Laundry, including 60ft chimney located in the middle of the site.

## Butcher Street

The 1899 valuation map shows use of this site included two public houses, a grocer and four shops, all facing onto Butcher Street. Included in Given's 1879 list are the occupations associated with the buildings that at that time existed in Butcher Street. See section Owners/Tenants. Butcher Street in 1625 called the Shambles, meaning a slaughterhouse. Street located closest to the Cow Bog or cattle market, which lay on low ground and outside the walls, in what is now Waterloo Street. New Meat Market/New Shambles established between East Wall and Linenhall Street, parallel to the alignment of Richmond Street in 1775. Buildings previous to those currently occupying the site in Butcher Street, demolished by 1990.

## Magazine Street

### 2 Magazine Street

'The Masonic Hall; this is a recent erection which reflects great credit on the esprit du corps of the Brethren of our City and the surrounding district. It is situated in Magazine Street near Butcher's Gate and though the front has a neat tetrastyle portico with some other architectural decorations, yet the appearance is much obscured by the neighbouring buildings. The apartments,, in the interior are however very spacious and are to be executed in a splendid style. A large Dining room, a Ball room of the same dimensions and a grand Council room occupy the body of the house. The cost of the entire erection will be about £1300. As the building is to be entrusted to the care of respectable individuals, a cafe and an ordinaire are to be established so that respectable strangers of the brotherhood, on visiting our City, can never be at a loss for comfortable entertainment. Our citizens also may be accommodated on particular occasions by making proper application, with the use of the Dining or Ball room.'

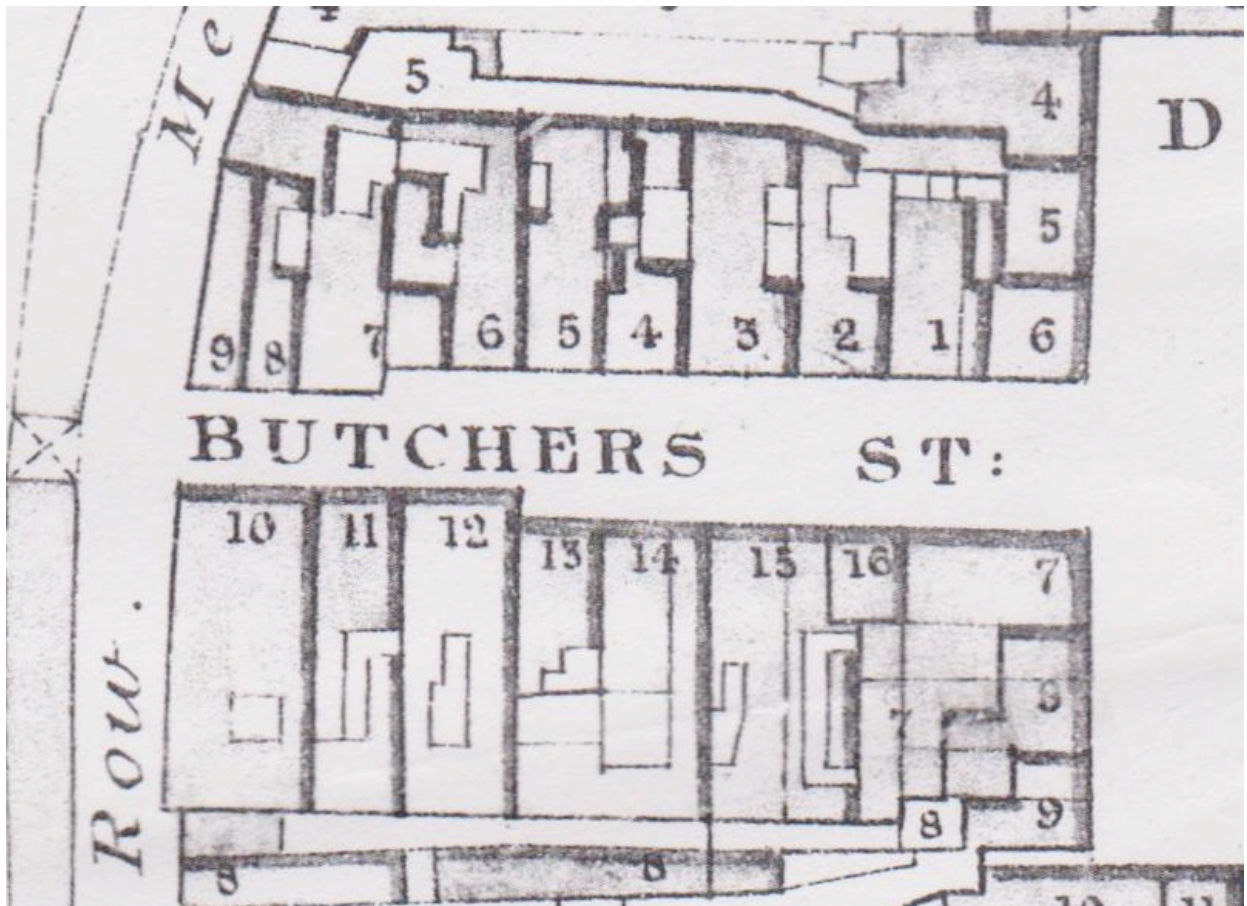

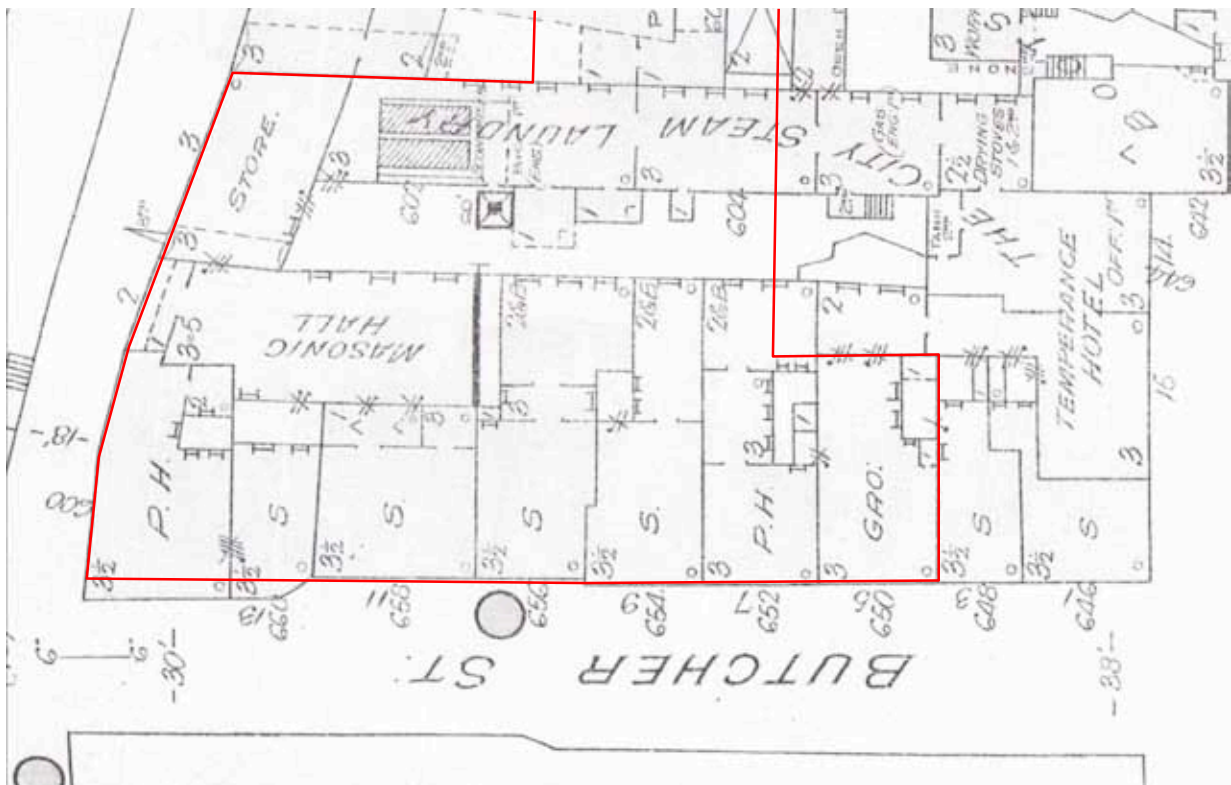

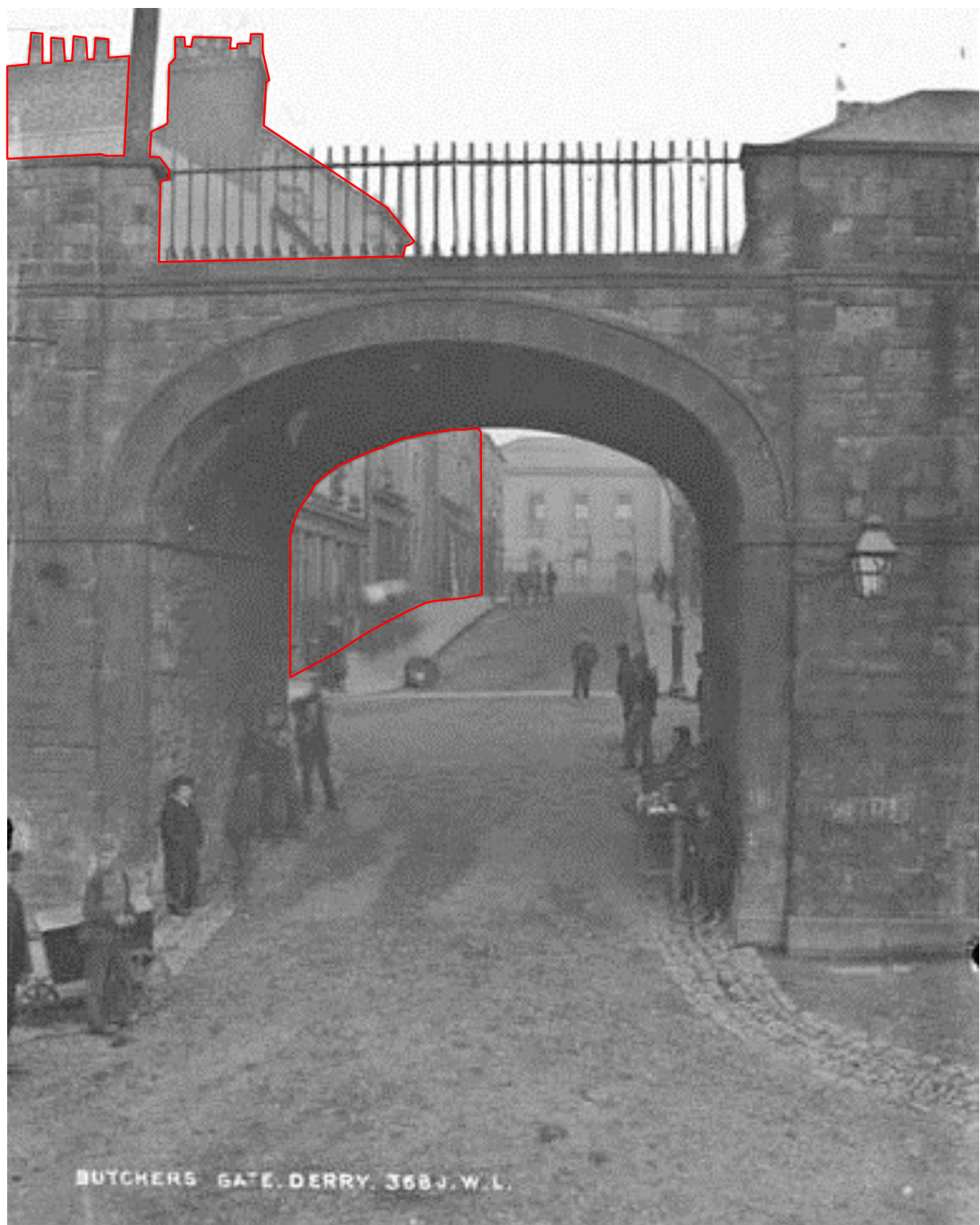


Butcher Street, Valuation Map, 1834

### Description

Three-storey, nine-bay (plus corner tower) building set at back edge of the pavement. Building runs almost the length of Butcher Street. (Closest part of building in photograph is that nearest to The Diamond, and right-hand side is closest to City Walls and Butcher Gate). Painted/coloured render at ground floor, black/dark grey brickwork at first floor, extensively (curtain walling) glazed at second floor. Generally fixed light polyester powder coated windows. Formerly the *Calgach Centre*.

### History

Butcher Street in 1625 called the Shambles, meaning a slaughterhouse. The street is located closest to the Cow Bog or cattle market, which lay on low ground outside the walls, in what is now Waterloo Street. New Meat Market/New Shambles established between East Wall and Linenhall Street in 1775. Concentration of slaughter related businesses still prevalent early 20th century, including butchers, saddler & harness maker and suppliers of leather goods. Buildings previous to those currently occupying the site in Butcher Street demolished by 1990.

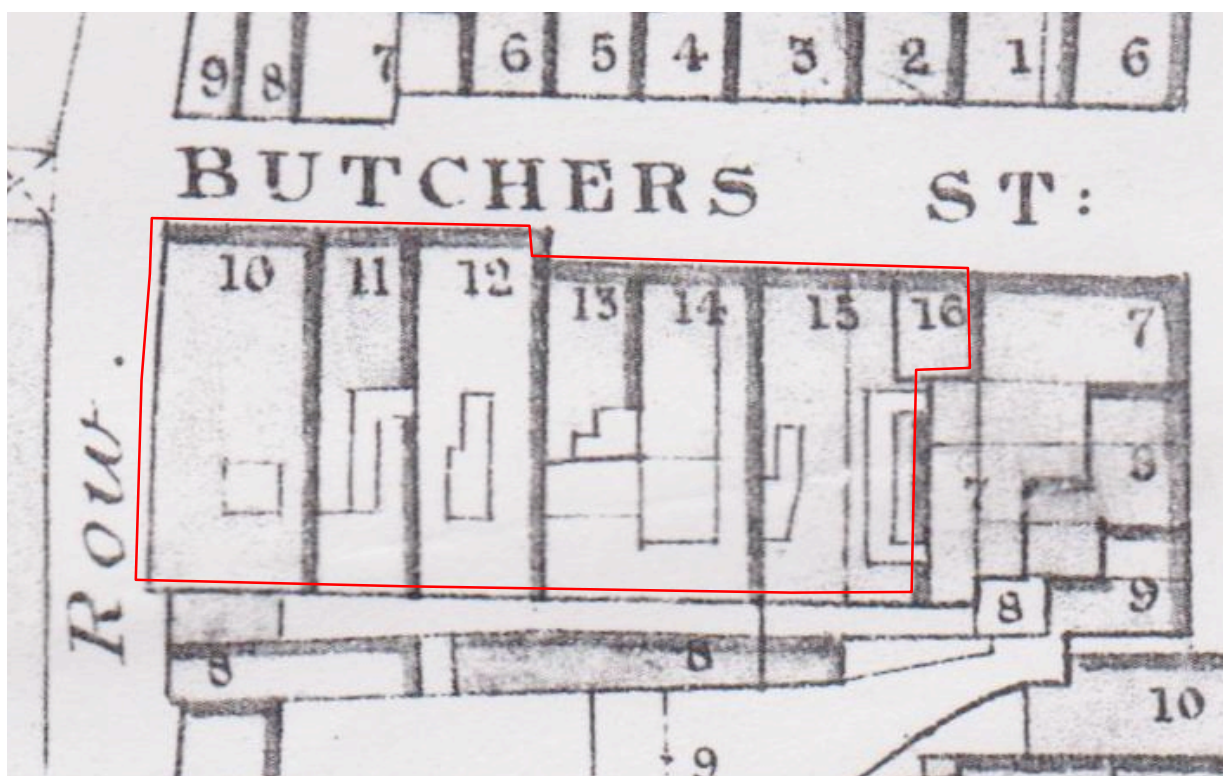

4-22 Butcher Street, Valuation Map, 1834

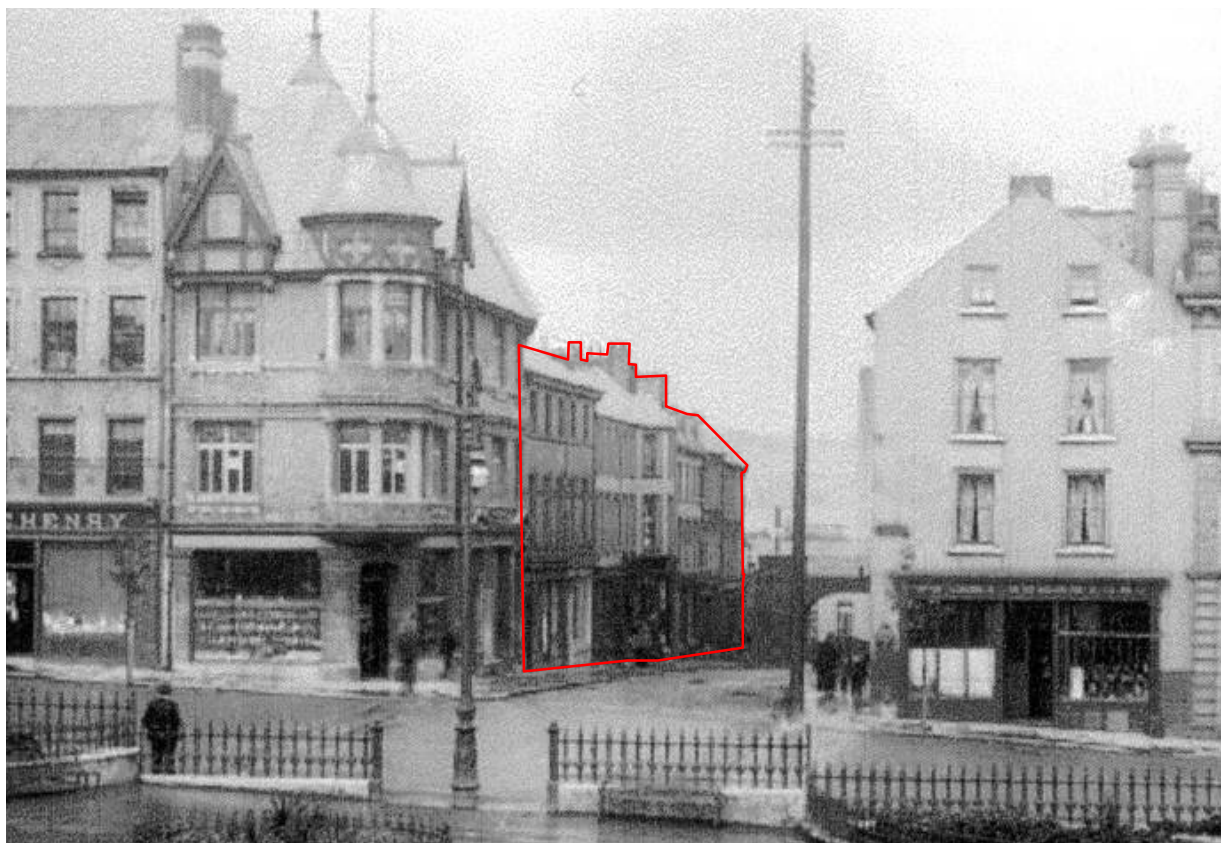


4-22 Butcher Street, Irish Society Map, 1857

## Description

Three-storey, two-bay, mid-terrace building, with red brick façade and natural slate roof. Two square-headed openings at first and second floors; paired windows on bay to left-hand side, at both first and second floors. Full-width cornice, frieze and architrave at head of first floor windows, stepped forward directly above openings. Pilasters to first floor windows, and decorative mouldings below sills (where showing) at first and second floors. Casement windows to all openings, margin lights to transom windows at first floor, small square panes to transom (twelve-over-two) windows at second floor. At ground floor, right-hand side, pilasters. Six-panel painted timber door. Transom light. Central Chambers signage above door; swan-neck pediment. Remainder of ground floor, to left, contemporary signage and external roller shutter.

'1899: Architects: Forman and Aston. A three-storey red brick building of character with elaborately shaped roofs in the style of Ernest Newton. It is of interest that the designer made a conscious attempt at resolving a corner building, and has been successful.'

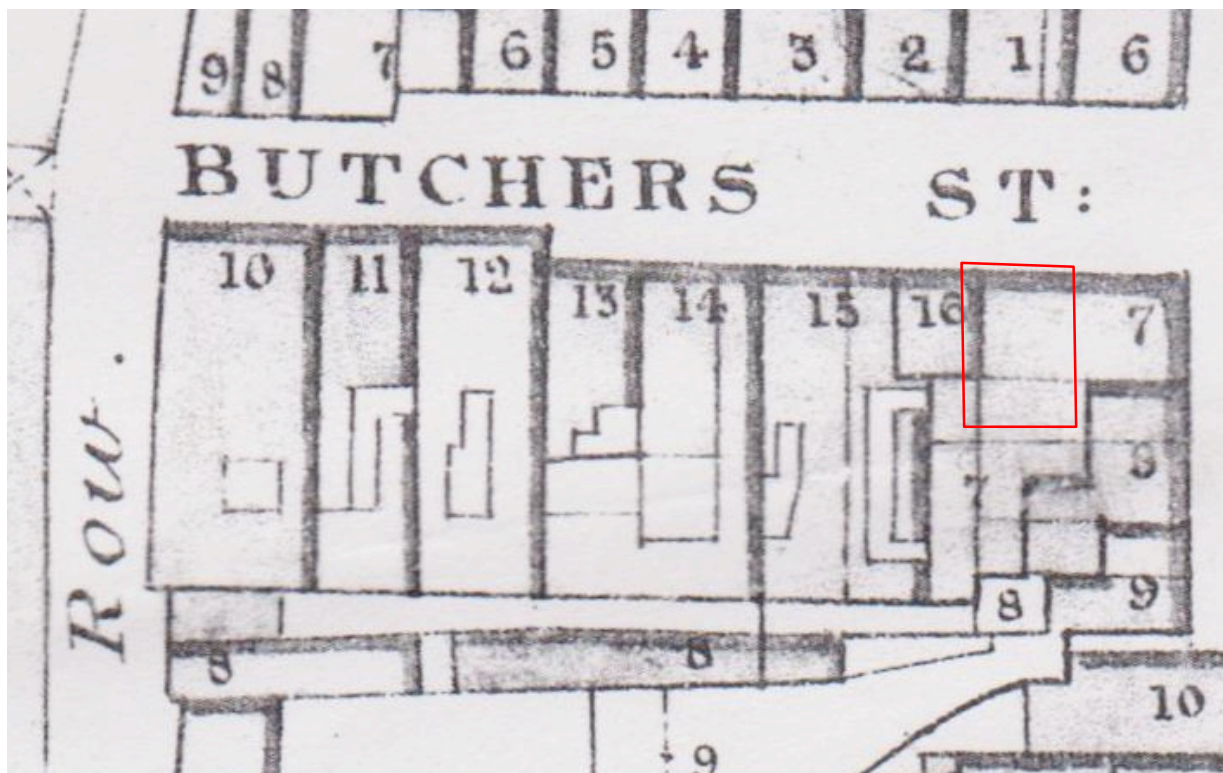

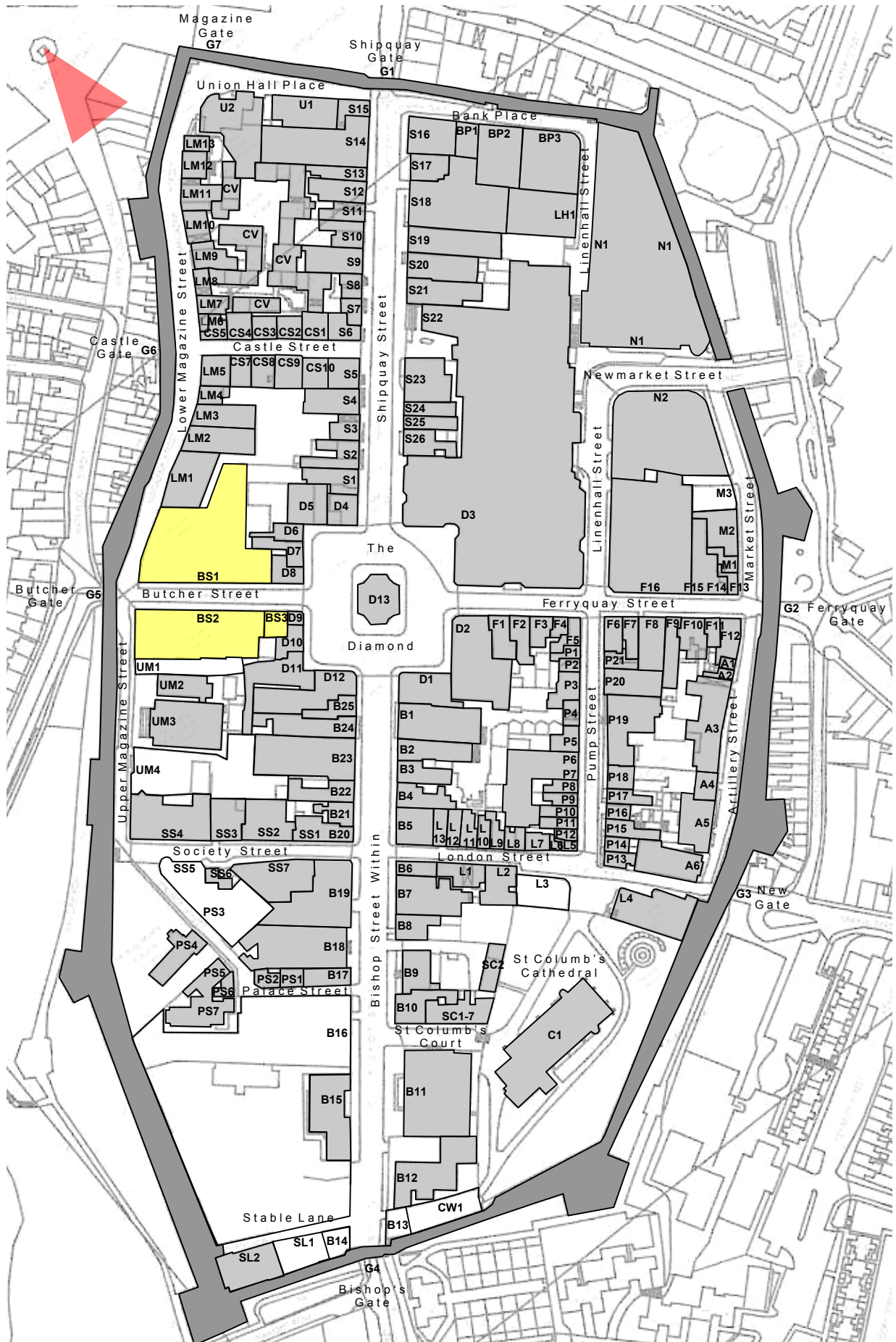

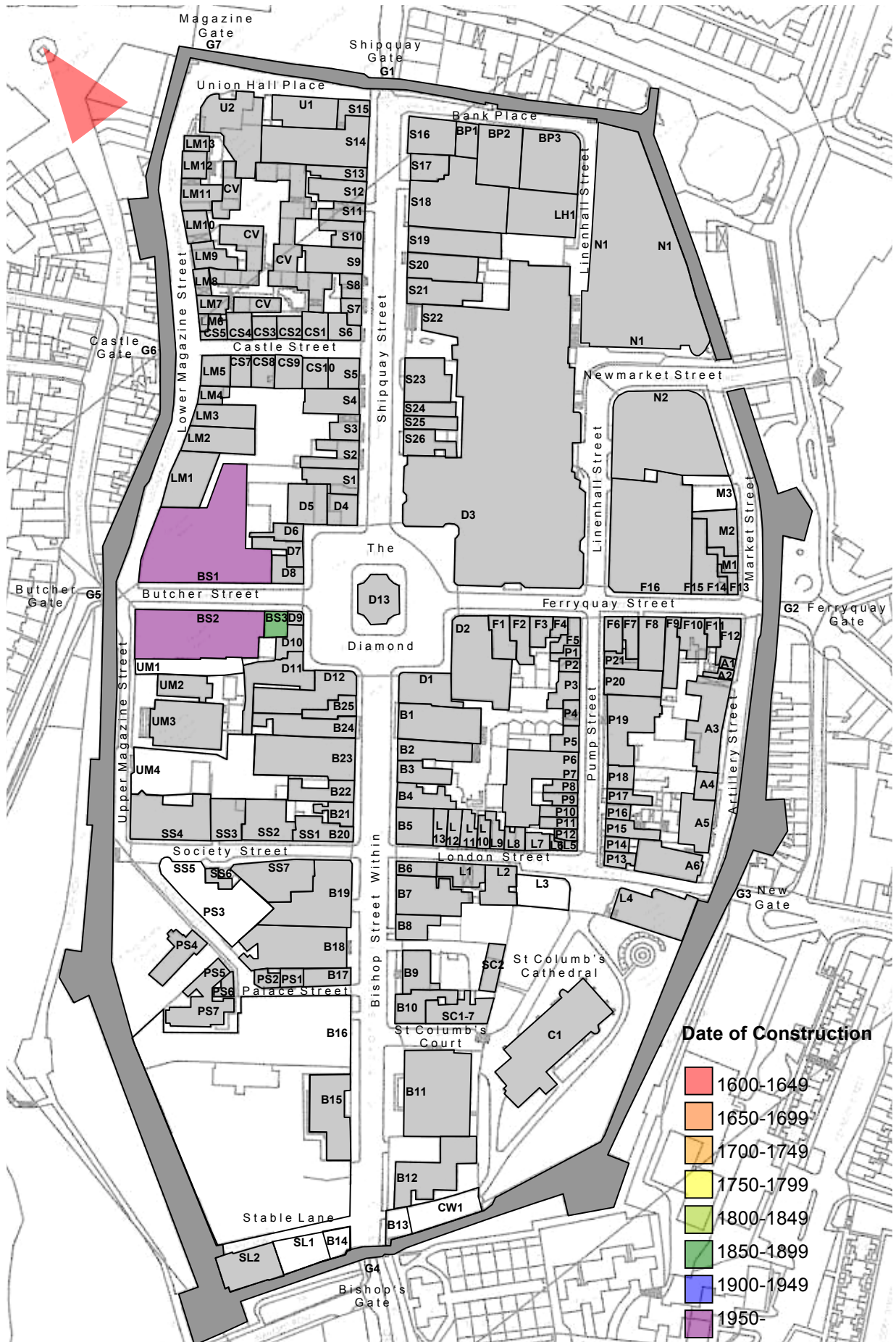
