

Three storey, (with fourth storey within mansard roof), four-bay, mid terrace building set at the back edge of the pavement. White painted red brick façade, rendered mouldings, natural slate mansard roof. At mansard roof level, on the half of the elevation to left-hand side is a gable of two bays, topped with ball finial. On the right-hand half of the building, a balustrade remains with dormer window behind. 3 No. double-height rendered pilasters running from first floor to second, with composite capitals, supporting a deep projecting cornice course with moulded brackets. All topped with ball finials. Windows mainly one-over-one vertical sliding sash painted timber windows, pane size all unequal at first floor, and all equal at second floor. 2no. paired, six-over-one arch headed windows within gable. All windows at first floor with small pediments; first floor left side contains canted projecting bay window with casements. At ground floor, plain pilasters with paired console brackets supporting cornice. Swan-neck pediments to either side of modern shopfront with separate entrance to side, plastic signage and external metal roller shutter.

Shallow arched headed openings at first floor, square headed at second floor. String course at second floor window sill level. One-overone painted timber, vertical sliding sash windows to front facade. Contemporary shopfront and fascia sign. Financial services use extends into first two bays of adjoining property to left at ground floor.



1899 valuation map indicates the left-hand side of the building was being used as a shop at ground floor and right-hand side as a bakery with ovens in the rear courtyard. Henry Thompson, cook and confectionery shop (bakery) from before 1876 to c. 1930, taken over by Stevenson & Co. Ltd, c.1930.





Four-bay, three-storey, mid-terrace building, formerly two properties set at the back edge of the pavement. Double pitched slate roof with two pitched roofed dormers. One-over-one, vertical sliding painted timber sash windows to front elevation. Contemporary shopfront with external roller shutters. Financial services use of adjoining property to right extended into first two-bays at ground floor of this property.

1899 site valuation map indicates the previous building on the site was divided in two, used in part, as a drug store (chemist), building demolished and site re-developed late-20th century.



Two-bay façade onto Ferryquay Street, five-bay façade to Pump Street, three-and-a-half storey, corner property set at the back edge of the pavement. Double pitched slate roof set at right angles to Ferryquay Street. Painted, smooth rendered façade. Window openings all square headed; all regularly spaced; all with plain moulded surround; with the exception of a single window opening within gable at high level at third floor which has no keystone motif and is round headed. One-over-one, vertical sliding painted timber sash windows throughout. Contemporary shopfront, fascia sign and external roller shutters. Splayed corner entrance to shop. The gabled form suggests late-18th century form and origins. Much altered. Absence of original fabric. Pump Street elevation to left in photograph.





Three-storey, three-bay corner property set at the back edge of the pavements, with elevation to Ferryquay Street, and also with gabled elevation to Pump Street (right-hand side in photograph). Twotone painted render façade above first floor window sill level, and natural slate double pitched roof. Window openings to first and second floors have three windows to Ferryquay Street and two to Pump Street. At first floor level square-headed window openings, with decorative rendered surrounds. At second floor level, at high level just below eaves, seven pairs of decorative brackets. At high level, in gable end to Pump Street, single round-headed window opening (blocked). Moulded band courses. Plain contemporary shopfront, signage and external roller shutters.






Three-storey, three-bay, mid-terrace property set at the back edge of the pavement with red brick façade above the first floor window sill level. Double-pitched natural slate roof with eaves brackets. Brick piers and metal balustrade above existing eaves removed. Round cornered, flat arched brick heads to first floor windows. Shallow arched window heads at second floor; the windows at second floor also shallow arched. One-over-one painted timber vertical sliding sash windows at first and second floors. Second floor, shallow projecting brick course; giving way to tooth projecting brick course; and sill. Sill painted at second floor and elements at first floor. Plain contemporary shopfront, signage and external roller shutters.



Five-bay, three-storey, mid-terrace property set at the back edge of the pavement. Double pitched slate roof. Painted, smooth rendered façade. Square headed windows throughout. Large picture window at first floor, in central position. Windows generally one-over-one plastic coated aluminium. Four plain triple height 'pilasters'. String course at top of ground floor but below first floor window sills and string course at second floor sill level. Ground floor, plain contemporary shopfront, external roller shutters.

History

Previously, two properties which came under single ownership circa 1880. The 1899 valuation map indicates that the building on the site at that time was occupied by Alex McCay & Co. Ltd, Grocers & Provisions, with carriage arch to the right-hand side of the building. During the late 20th century the site was re-developed with a two-storey, flat roofed building set at the back edge of the pavement, with windowless profiled metal cladding above contemporary shopfront and signage. Site re-developed again circa 2008, including refurbishment and alterations to nos. 6-8 Pump Street.





Second floor windows two-over-two, painted timber vertical sliding sash windows. Windows and sills at first floor obscured by signage. Contemporary shopfront and signage at ground floor.



Windows at first and second floors all painted timber vertical sliding sash windows. Either side, at ground floor, are two remaining shopfront consoles. Contemporary shopfront, signage and external roller shutters.



Façade subdivided horizontally by a wide sill course at second floor window sill level, and a narrow sill course at first floor level. Windows on street façade all have decorative mouldings and key stone feature. All windows at first and second floor levels one-over-one, vertical sliding painted timber sash windows. Shopfront with fluted pilasters, stall riser, cornice and console brackets. Plain door to side, square-headed fixed light above. External roller shutters.

1899 valuation map indicates the site is occupied by a four-storey building, set at the back edge of the pavement and being used as a shop on the ground floor, ruin in rear curtilage; site re-developed shortly thereafter, circa 1900, with current three-storey building.


Three-storey, two-bay, with three-bay to Market Street, corner property on Ferryquay St, and Market St, set at the back edge of pavement. (See also the F5 map reference: No.15A Ferryquay St., on corner of Pump Street). Double-pitched, natural slate hipped roof with terracotta hip tiles. Roof pitches currently equal pitch. Rendered chimney over the ridge, not centrally positioned, and located on the gable end adjoining the property next door in Market Street. Painted, smooth rendered façade. Ground floor has plain pilasters on plinths and with ionic capitals. These are set either side of the building's elevation onto Ferryquay Street, and either side of main entrance (off Market Street). The Ferryquay Street elevation has a wide and slightly bowed, multi-paned, window and skirting set between the pilasters and, rising onto the lower part of first floor, two mountings above pilasters, finishing in mini-pediments, swan-neck in form. The entrance, on Market St, is broken pediment, swan's neck in form. Continuous painted fascia and cornice to street frontages. At first floor, six-over-one, top-hung painted timber replacement casement windows, one-over-one casements at second floor. Externally mounted roller shutters. Moulded anchor sign between the two first floor windows on Ferryquay St.



Double pitched natural slate gable roof, bracketed at eaves. Two large brick chimneys centrally positioned over ridge located on end gables. End gables unpainted. Square headed window openings at first and third floors and a mix of shallow arched headed windows and paired round headed windows at second floor. 2no. original shallow rectangular projecting windows, see photograph c1908, at first floor removed. Contemporary shopfronts and signage and with external roller shutters.







Two-storey, nine-bay building with splayed corner on to Linenhall Street. Building set at the back edge of the pavement with rendered façade above shopfront fascia and brick façade to Linenhall Street. Flat roof concealed behind low parapet wall. Square first floor window openings regularly spaced, UPVC casement windows. Contemporary shopfront with deep fascia.

History

Previously occupied; site of four mid to late-Victorian, four and three-and-a-half storey, buildings set at the back edge of the pavement; also three, two-and-a-half storey and single storey buildings to rear, formerly nos.2-4 Linenhall Street. 1899 valuation map indicates nos. 28-30 were occupied by Irvine & Co. with hosiery, tailoring, carpet departments; showrooms and workrooms to rear; rear courtyard with stabling accessed from Linenhall Street. No.32, part of City Arcade occupied by J J Pollock, furniture until circa 1920, later occupied by F W Woolworth & Co. and redeveloped with purpose built store for F W Woolworth & Co. circa 1950s.





28-32 Ferryquay Street, Ordnance Survey map, 1873




28-32 Ferryquay Street, Valuation Map, 1899








Irvine's & Co., 28 Ferryquay Street and 2-4 Linenhall Street, circa 1935





Description








2-26 Ferryquay Street, Valuation Map, 1899




Richmond Centre, Diamond and Shipquay Street Elevation, Keppie Henderson and Partners, 1980




Richmond Centre, Diamond and Ferryquay Street Elevation, Keppie Henderson and Partners, 1980




