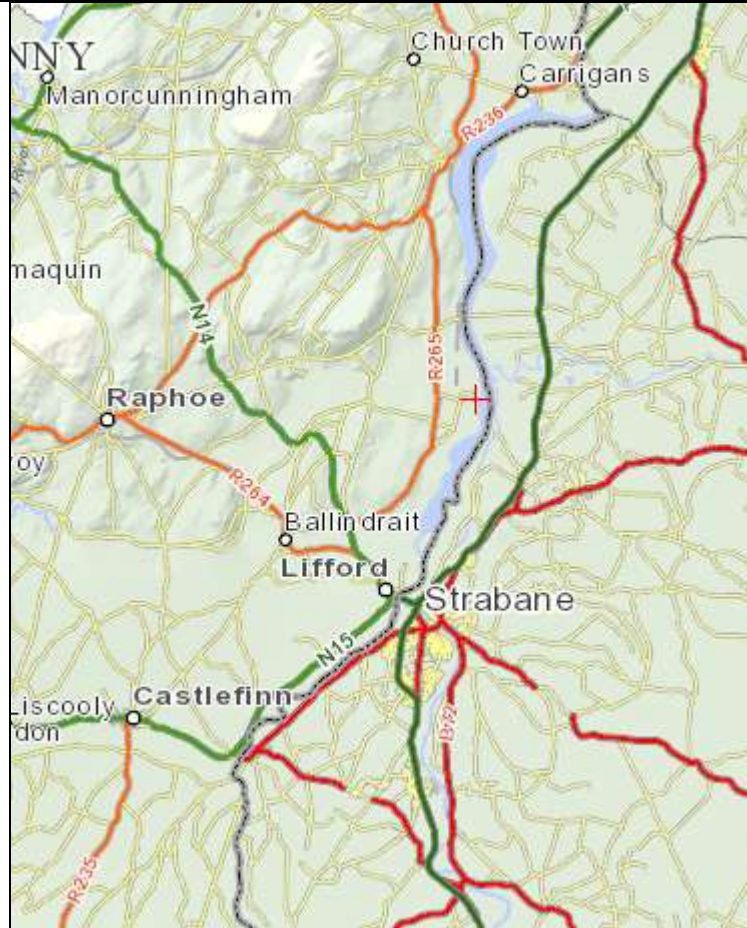
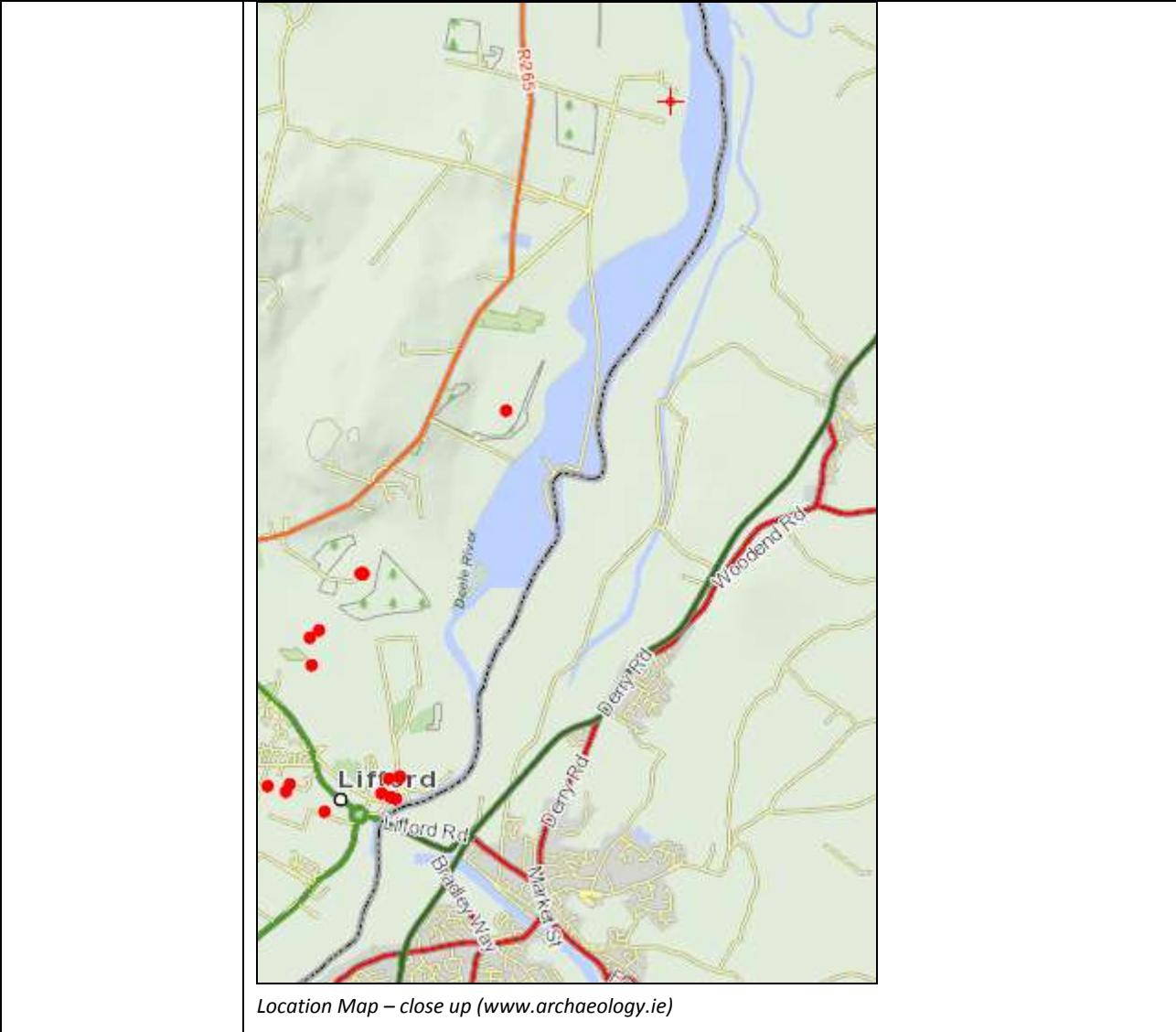


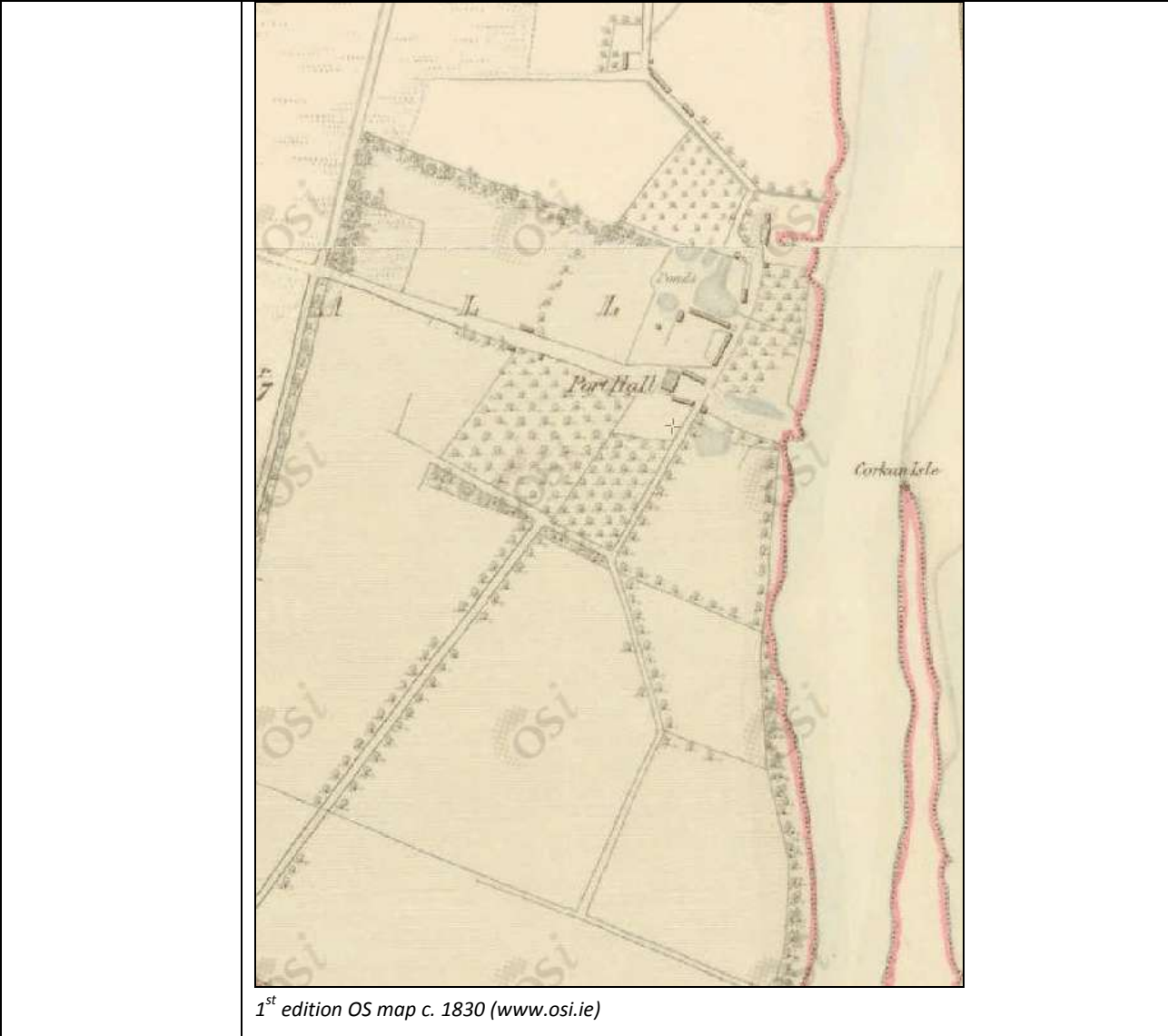

| <b>Site Description</b>            | <p>Detached five-bay two-storey over basement mid-Georgian house built in 1746 with dormer attic with Diocletian windows to gables to entrance and rear facades. Double-pitched slates with wet dashed chimneys with stone copings and lead downpipes, hoppers and brackets with marreco insignia to hipers, parapet walls. Painted wet dashed c. 1965 with ashlar quoin stones, cornice and parapet coping, ashlar coat-of-arms over entrance, ashlar parallel quoins to breakfront. Timber sash windows, c. 1960, with original crown glass and with folded aluminium draft-sealing and stone cills, timber panelled doors with Gibbs surround, dated keystone, and sidelights, ashlar Gibbs surrounds to frontage windows, stone steps and iron ba Timber lugged architraves to timber panelled doors, marble fireplaces, timber stairs, run cornices to most rooms, brick-paved floor to basement wine cellar, timber dado rails and wainscoting. Detached seven- and eight-bay two-storey former warehouses to north and south side of courtyard to east with double pitch slate roofs, whitewashed rubble stone walls, and brick arches to openings, rubble stone walls to enclosed garden to west (entrance) s Previous owner Mr. Marreco did extensive maintenance and renovation work 1950-1970. S - avenue of trees and surrounding land with house is very attractive; G refers to good farm/outbuildings - timber sash windows, lunettes, etc.</p> |                        |

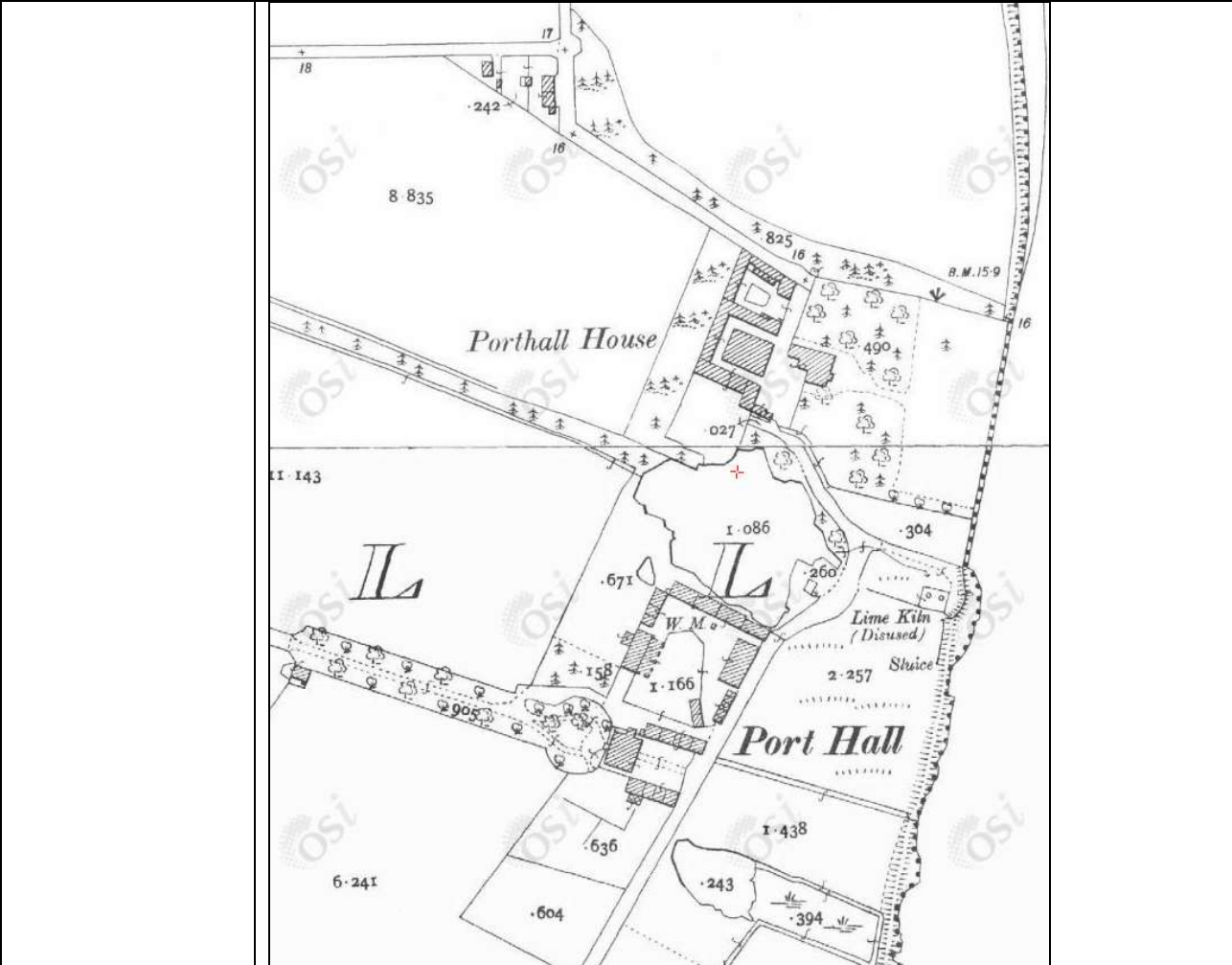
