#### Description

Two-and-a-half-storey, eleven-bay, terrace of five terraced houses. Red brick facades. Street paving runs directly to facades. Natural slate double pitched roof, stepped and with two gables to front. Four large red brick chimneys centrally positioned over the ridge. Paired painted timber brackets at eaves. Square-headed brick arched openings to ground and first floors; painted cream and black sections to the top part of gables that are above the half storey (top floor) windows. Façade window all with painted stone sills and two-over-two vertical sliding painted timber sash windows. At ground floor, six square-headed openings with doors of four-panels painted timber. Transom lights.

'1900. Architect: J Ballentine. A terrace of plain red-brick three-storey houses of reasonable appearance designed as a unit, with symmetrical gables over two [four] of the houses.'



### Description

Long and narrow, single storey building with semi-basement, accessed from St Columb's Cathedral Graveyard. Red brick frontage unto graveyard. Unpainted rendered gables with copings. Natural slate shallow double-pitched roof with one painted smooth rendered chimney centrally positioned over the ridge. Square-headed openings with rendered surrounds, also four slot openings. Casement windows and part glazed stained timber door. Approached via concrete steps metal handrail.

### **History**

Previously an ancillary building within the rear curtilage of the Deanery, built 1833. Now Music Room dedicated to the memory of Cecil Frances Alexander (1818 -1895). Polished granite plaque fixed to wall with inscription, 'The Cecil Frances Alexander Music Room, Inaugurated in her memory, 1981.'

Cecil Frances Alexander (1818 -1895) wife of Bishop Alexander, lived for a time at the Bishop's Palace, and wrote some of the most popular hymns in the English language. In 1848 she published 'Hymns for Little Children' which included the Christmas Carol 'Once in Royal David's City', the Easter verses 'There is a Green Hill Far Away' and 'All Things Bright and Beautiful'.


