

Site Description	This fortified town was built on the site of an O'Neill Castle. It is set on the S of the River Foyle. At SW, a ploughed-out bastion is clearly visible, but not measurable. A ditch to its outside is about 12m wide. In the field to SE a 2nd possible bastion is visible to the S end of the field. At the N end a fairly rectangular platform is visible & is probably the site of the O'Neill Castle. A cobbled bridge over the stream at E may be original. See SM7 for further details.	
Landscape Context (setting)	Located in farmland (Tillage) on the south bank of the River Foyle approximately 4km southwest of Newbuildings. This was a strategic position on the river Foyle, overlooking the Cineál Eoghain in Inishowen and being between the towns of Derry and Strabane.	
Site Appraisal	This is a scheduled site and area, which is an indication of its significance to the archaeological record of Northern Ireland.	
Sensitivity	This site is located in farmland and likely to be interfered with by ploughing and by grazing animals.	
Associations:	This site is not directly associated with any other monuments that are similar in either type or date, however, it may have been associated with the settlements in Derry and Strabane being almost equidistant and close to the main route that connects these two early towns.	
Recommendations	This site is relatively accessible from the A5 road but has no real visitor potential, as there are few visual remains extant.	






NIEA SMR map: TYR 001:002 is marked as no. 2 &3




NIEA SMR map: TYR 001:002 is marked as no. 2
